Re: Discontinuing Issuing Temporary Insurance Producer License for New Resident Applicants

Effective August 13, 2020, the Connecticut Insurance Department (the “Department”) will cease accepting applications for temporary resident insurance producer licenses as permitted by the April 21, 2020 notice (“the notice”) and rescinds the temporary waiver for applicants for producer licenses of the requirement of successfully passing an examination as a condition to licensure. Any and all applications for a temporary resident insurance producer license received by the Department on or after August 13, 2020, will not be processed *until the required state examination* has been successfully passed.

Effective August 14, 2020, all individuals seeking licensure as a resident insurance producer will be required to meet the Connecticut insurance producer licensure requirements provided in Connecticut law, including successfully passing any required examination(s).

All current temporary resident insurance producer licenses issued under the notice will remain in effect until expiration of the license.

Temporary resident insurance producer license applications filed with the Department on or before Aug 13 that meet the requirements of the notice, will be approved. Applications that do not meet the requirements of the notice, including those applications where applicants failed to adequately respond to requests for information from the Department with the information requested on or before that date, will be held until the required state examination has been successfully passed.

All temporary licenses will automatically expire 180 days from the date of issuance unless applicant has submitted an email advising that they have passed the exam. Email: cid.licensing@ct.gov. Be sure to include your license number or national producer number (NPN).

Upon receipt, the Department will convert the temporary resident insurance producer license to a resident standard lines producer license *with no additional fees*.

The Department will update the expiration date to the appropriate *birth month expiration* and will send an email confirmation.
